What Is The Tertiary Pairing Project?

Wearable Art Mandurah is raising the bar with the introduction of the Tertiary Pairing Project. This project provides students with an opportunity to collaborate with a student from a different institution, state or country, to explore the concept of **migration**.

Students will be nominated by their college or university and paired by Wearable Art Mandurah.

They will work together to create a complementary pair of garments that will be brought to life on stage at the Wearable Art Mandurah Showcase in November 2020.

This is an opportunity for students studying subjects of all disciplines, from fashion and art, to architecture and engineering, to create revolutionary works of art on the body.

What is Wearable Art Mandurah?

Wearable Art Mandurah is the largest wearable art competition in Australia and an internationally recognised event that attracts a large audience. Entries come from across the globe.

Migration as a theme

Here are a few ideas that might inspire:

- Mandurah's wetland birds that travel the East-Asian Australasian Flyway
- Population diversity and human migration
- The migration of goods through trade and industry
